The Keith Famie Visionalist **Entertainment Productions** documentary "Can You See How I See?" premieres at 7 p.m. Saturday at the Birmingham 8 theater, 211 S. Old Woodward Ave. in Birmingham.

Castro has run in the New York City Marathon, completed a triathlon and has climbed a 14,500-foot mountain in Colorado.

The film includes Jordyn Castor, a 16-year-old student born blind, George Wurtzel, a blind carpenter, blind musicians and business leaders and two leader dog recipients from Chile who receive guide dogs and training from Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester.

"It's a film about what it's like to be blind," Famie said. "I can tell you this film will change the way you look at people who are blind."
